

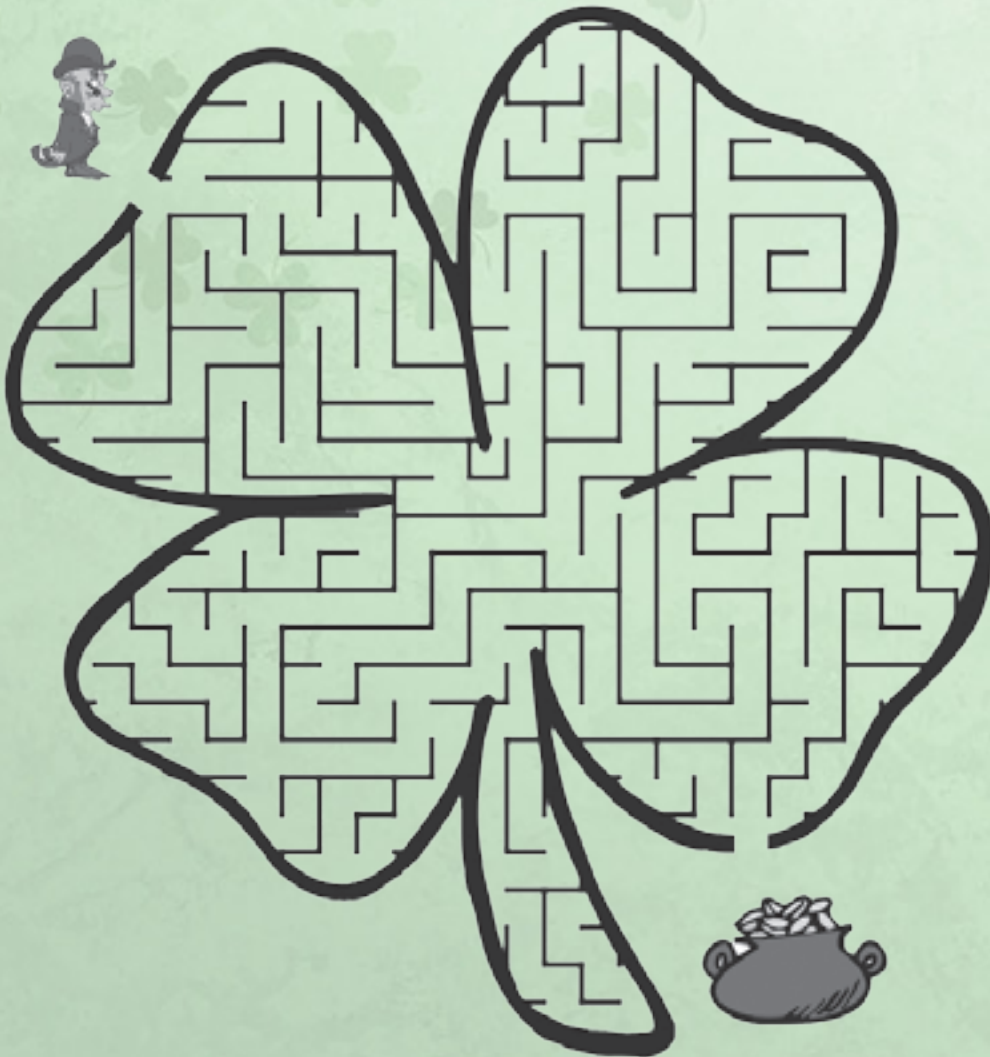


Dr. Seuss' Birthday

Yes, there really was a Dr. Seuss. He was not an official doctor, but his prescription for fun has delighted readers for more than 60 years. Theodor ("Ted") Seuss Geisel was born on March 2, 1904, in Springfield, Massachusetts. His father, Theodor Robert, and grandfather were brewmasters and enjoyed great financial success for many years. His mother, Henrietta Seuss Geisel, had worked in her father's bakery before marrying Ted's father, often memorizing the names of the pies that were on special each day and 'chanting' them to her customers. If Ted had difficulty getting to sleep, she would often recall her 'pie-selling chants.' As an adult, Ted credited his mother "for the rhythms in which I write and the urgency with which I do it."

Ted attended Dartmouth College where he worked hard to become the editor in chief of Dartmouth's humor magazine. His reign as editor came to an abrupt end when Ted was caught throwing a party that did not coincide with school policy. He continued to contribute to the magazine, merely signing his work as "Seuss." This is the first record of his use of the pseudonym Seuss, which was both his middle name and his mother's maiden name. It was a perfectly ingenious pseudonym; it squeaked Ted's work past unsuspecting college officials, yet clearly identified him as the creator.

From all those who enjoyed reading his tales as a child and for all the generations to come that will get the same pleasure from his stories, Happy Birthday, Dr. Seuss!

Healthy Fettuccine



- 1/4 Onion – peeled and chopped
- 2 medium size white potatoes – peeled and chopped
- 1/2 cup mixed nuts
- 1 TBS. Italian dressing
- 1 TSP. lemon juice
- 1 TBS. parsley flakes
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1 lb. fettuccine
- parmesan/romano cheese (optional)
- Grilled chicken (optional)

For the sauce, boil onion and potatoes in water for 10 minutes or until done. Remove from water, but save at least 2 cups of the water. Place nuts, onion and potatoes in a blender, blending well. Blend in at least 1-1/2 cups of water with the nuts, onion and potatoes, then add all of the other ingredients except the fettuccine. Add remaining saved water if sauce is too thick. While the onions and potatoes are boiling, prepare 12-14 ounces of fettuccine according to directions on package. Drain pasta and stir in the sauce while both are still hot. Sprinkle with parmesan/romano cheese. Serve immediately. Grilled, sliced chicken may be added if desired.
